What is the New Apostolic Reformation? The New Apostolic Reformation is not an official Christian organization with clearly stated beliefs. Rather, it has been described by most as a network of charismatic leaders who share similar teachings and a common vision for the Visible Church.

Much of what it believes and teaches has some basis in Scripture. For instance, God's desire to prosper and equip the saints with the necessary Spiritual Gifts and Anointing to take the Gospel of salvation and healing to the world.

However, these promises are often taken to extreme by some within the NAR Movement, to where claiming God's blessings of abundance becomes more important than growing in maturity and holiness in anticipation for the Lord's return!

Another important Biblical truth the New Apostolic Reformation emphasizes is that God has begun to restore the Office of Apostles and of Prophets to the Body of Christ over the last few decades, and only when the Church recognizes their authority will it be able to fulfil the Great Commission effectively.

The only problem within the NAR Movement is that its leaders do not have enough knowledge of Scripture to distinguish between the Office of Prophet and the simple Gift of Prophecy!

Misunderstanding along these lines has resulted in a continual flood of bizarre declarations and false predictions over the last few years, bringing terrible reproach on Christ's Name! Other Christian leaders have invested much time and energy warning and correcting them, yet they still continue in their error! For this reason alone, Christian Ministers should safeguard their flock against the New Apostolic Reformation and reject those who choose to be associated with it!

But there is another reason why Christians should steer clear of NAR teaching and practices. When they speak of the Church fulfilling its Great Commission, this does not only imply spiritual control over the world, but political control also! This has absolutely no foundation in Scripture or even Church History!
