In 1993, the Southern Baptist Convention (SBC) conducted an investigation of Freemasonry. Even though the report stated that some of its' teachings are incompatible with Christianity, it then concluded that membership is "a matter of individual conscience." This evaluation by the SBC has since served as an endorsement for Christian membership in the Lodge. In the Scottish Rite Journal, a Masonic Periodical, one Mason wrote:

The vote of the Southern Baptist Convention is a historic and positive turning point for Freemasonry.

Basically, it is a vitalization of our Fraternity by America's largest Protestant denomination, after nearly a year of thorough, scholarly study.

At the same time, it is a call to renewed effort on the part of all Freemasons today to re-energize our Fraternity and move forward to fulfilling its mission as the world's foremost proponent of the Brotherhood of Man under the Fatherhood of God.

Can the reader see how ridiculous this is? Christians can now justify their involvement in Freemasonry by claiming it is a matter of conscience when the evidence is clear the Southern Baptist Convention has rejected conscience!! This explains why they will not repent. They cannot!
